



## Theatre Denton Theatre School COVID-19 Safety Protocols

We are pleased to introduce the safety procedures for all classes, rehearsals, and performances.

Updated 2/25/22 to reflect current CDC recommendations.

- Staff and Volunteers are required to receive the full series of a COVID-19 vaccine and a booster dose if eligible.
- Participants and Patrons are highly recommended to receive the full series of a COVID-19 vaccine and a booster dose if eligible.
- Staff, Volunteers, Participants, and Patrons are asked to self-screen before attending any classes, rehearsals, and/or performances.
- Prior to admission, Staff, Volunteers, and Participants will have their temperature taken with a touchless thermometer. Anyone with a fever of 100.0°F or above will not be admitted.
- When COVID-19 Community Levels are Medium or Low as defined by the CDC:
  - A face mask is recommended for all Staff, Volunteers, Participants, and Patrons. Consistent with CDC guidelines, N-95, KN-95, KF-94, disposable surgical, or cloth surgical-type masks that fit snugly to the face are highly recommended. Any type of face mask or shield is acceptable.
- When COVID-19 Community Levels are High as defined by the CDC:
  - For the protection of the Students and Staff, all Staff, Volunteers, Participants, and Patrons must wear a face mask properly at all times. Those arriving without a mask must acquire one before entering or will not be admitted.
  - Students must provide their own acceptably protective face mask. Consistent with CDC recommendations, only N-95, KN-95, KF-94, disposable surgical, or cloth surgical-type masks that fit snugly to the face will be allowed. Shields (worn without a mask) and respirator masks (with a vent valve) are not considered adequate protection. Properly fitted N-95, KN-95, or KF-94 masks are highly recommended.

### TECHNICAL REHEARSALS AND PERFORMANCES

- Students should arrive at the theatre already in base costume and make-up and ready to take the stage.
- ONLY required personnel may be admitted backstage during technical rehearsals and performances.

### \*Self-screening

Prior to coming to classes, rehearsals, or performances, assess for any of the following signs or symptoms:

- Fever (greater than 100.0°F)
- Chills
- Unexplained new or worsening cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Unexplained muscle or body aches
- Unexplained sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
- Unexplained headache
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Unexplained congestion or runny nose
- Close contact with anyone diagnosed with COVID-19
